Tennis League Guidelines

Effective - August 1, 2009

Updated - April 21, 2018, July 6, 2021

The objective of these guidelines is to provide a supportive atmosphere for the game, to foster participation at every level, and to ensure the tennis program for SCO men, women, and youth thrives. Each decision should be made with common sense and with the intent to increase tennis participation by SCO residents where possible. These guidelines should be revisited as needed to monitor their effectiveness in achieving the objectives outlined above.

Team Composition:

SCO tennis teams will be fielded solely by residents but may include their accompanied guests. Those who are interested in playing league tennis should contact Tennis Committee at Tennis@springcreekoaks.org.

The final decision to add a new player or to transfer a player from another team is an individual team decision and will not be addressed by the Tennis Committee or these guidelines.

Any team that requires the addition of non-resident players should be mindful of the following:

- Team captain and co-captain must be residents.
- Keys to facilities are provided to residents only.
- Non-resident players must be always accompanied by a resident.

Any new team wishing to play out of Spring Creek Oaks should submit their roster to the Tennis Committee to verify residency requirements as specified in the Tennis Court Usage Rules. Any new team of less than 50% SCO residents must petition and be approved by the Tennis Committee to ensure adequate court availability. Any team of less than 50% SCO residents must reapply for admission each season. A non-resident team fee of \$300.00 per season will apply to these teams and is due prior to court assignment.

Roster Submission:

League rosters will be submitted to the Tennis Committee to schedule courts for each season. Verification of current HOA dues is mandatory before play begins.

Teams will not receive court assignments without roster submission and a non-resident team fee if applicable.

League Member Requirements:

All team members should be knowledgeable of the SCO Tennis Court Usage rules published on the SCO website.

Scorecards are stored in the women's restroom of Clubhouse 2 and the bath house on the Kuehnle ball field for league use. They are to be returned when matches are complete. Players and spectators are

required to place all trash in receptacles on the court and in the large barrels at each tennis location. Place spoilage items inside some kind of trash bag prior to placing in the large barrels. Please keep the area clean.

No excessive noise should occur after the lights are out. Be respectful of your neighbors.

Court Brooms should be re-hung on fence after use. Squeegees must be re-hung in Roller Hanger cover to protect the rollers from the sun and rain damages.

If something needs to be repaired (a net, a screen, a lock on the gate, etc.), please notify the tennis committee so that this can be addressed in a timely manner!
